Dear Members of the Committee,

Metro Cities submits this letter in support of HF 28 which would provide flexibility in the administration of state business subsidy awards due to COVID-19 and the Governor's peacetime emergency.

Cities are instrumental to economic development in Minnesota. They partner with businesses looking start or expand in their community. The state's key economic development funds, administered by DEED through the Minnesota Investment Fund (MIF) and Job Creation Fund (JCF), support private sector investments in employees and capital. Wage requirements as well as capital investment requirements serve as parameters to ensure public policy purposes are being met.

Due to the economic downturn created by the pandemic, cities, and MIF and JCF award recipients support flexibility in the state's business subsidy programs. HF 28 targets flexibility to the pay-for-performance Job Creation Fund as well as flexibility to recipients of MIF awards.

Metro Cities appreciates your work on these issues in response to the health pandemic and the consideration of this important flexibility to cities and their residents, employers, and taxpayers.
