- (c) Until the commissioner of human services develops another mechanism for collecting and verifying data on out-of-home placements of Indian children, and the legislature authorizes the use of that data, the data collected under this subdivision must be used to calculate payments under subdivision 3. The commissioner of human services shall certify the information to the commissioner of revenue by July 1 of the year prior to the aid payment.
- Subd. 3. Aid payments. For aids payable in calendar year 2019 and thereafter, the commissioner of revenue shall reimburse each county for 100 percent of the nonfederal share of the cost of out-of-home placement of Indian children provided the commissioner of human services, in consultation with the commissioner of corrections, certifies to the commissioner of revenue that accurate data is available to make the aid determination under this section. The amount of reimbursement is the county's average nonfederal share of the cost for out-of-home placement of Indian children for the most recent three calendar years for which data is available.
