Dear Chair Hornstein, Chair Newman, and Members of the Conference Committee,

On behalf of the 135 members of the Minnesota Asset Building Coalition, I want to thank the House and Senate Transportation Committees for hearing the Driver's License Suspension Reform bill (<u>SF 432/HF 336</u>). This bill was introduced by Senator Ingebrigtsen and Representative Becker-Finn and has bipartisan support in both bodies. We urge you to include the provisions from this bill in the Conference Committee Report.

Ending driver's license suspensions for unpaid traffic tickets would address a serious problem recently highlighted in both a <u>feature story</u> and an <u>editorial</u> in the Star Tribune. Over the last few decades, the state has increased fines, fees and surcharges, in part to help cover state and local government expenses, and these increases can lead to a cascade of consequences for those who are unable to pay. When someone fails to pay a traffic ticket, they suffer a double penalty: the debt is sent to collections with a late fee and a 20% surcharge, and additionally, their driver's license is suspended. National data shows that 60% of low-income people who lose their driver's license lose their job, which can quickly lead to financial crisis.

The Minnesota Department of Public Safety estimates it would issue 144,000 fewer driver's license suspensions per year if the legislature passes this bill, a 60% reduction. Law enforcement ticket about 36,000 drivers every year for driving on a suspended license, so a significant reduction in license suspensions would also enable law enforcement to focus more time on dangerous driving violations and other threats to public safety and prosecutors to spend less time prosecuting payment violations.

The Minnesota State Bar Association, the Minnesota County Attorneys Association, and the State Public Defender's Office have all endorsed this bill. In an <u>op-ed</u> published last year, County Attorneys from across Minnesota argued:

Suspending licenses hasn't worked as an enforcement tool...Driver's license suspensions should be reserved for the sole purpose of ensuring safe roads, not demanding payment from people who may be struggling to meet their families' basic needs.

Ending driver's license suspensions for unpaid traffic tickets is also supported by a diverse group of national organizations, including the Southern Poverty Law Center, the ACLU, the National Conference of Chief Justices (CCJ), the National Conference of State Court Administrators (CSCA), and the National Center for State Courts (NCSC). We hope this year Minnesota will follow the lead of the twelve states that have already stopped suspending driver's licenses for unpaid traffic tickets and enact this reform.
