RE: Support for HF1175, Written Testimony

As the mother of two school-age children and a registered, licensed occupational therapist who works as the coordinator for third-party reimbursement at the Minneapolis Public Schools, I know firsthand that passage of HF1175 is a win for Minnesota children, families, schools, and the State of Minnesota.

#### HF1175 is a win for Minnesota children:

- Minnesota children are in urgent need of mental health services (1).
- Schools aim to *prevent* serious mental health diagnoses by providing services relevant to children's needs, development, and learning abilities.
- HF1175 will bolster mental health services that are already being provided *year-round* to children of all ages in schools who have eligible needs (2, 3).

### HF1175 is a win for Minnesota families:

- Special education services are carved out of Medicaid; there is no cost to families. Medicaid reimbursement for school-based services does not affect public or private coverage, TEFRA, waivered programs, limits, or thresholds (4).
- Families can access qualified mental health providers, both in schools and the community, because all mental
  health providers in Minnesota have the same education, training, certification, and licensing requirements (5).

## HF1175 is a win for Minnesota schools:

- HF1175 will allow schools to access federal Medicaid funds for special education mental health services rather than drawing down their educational funds and increasing cross-subsidy (6).
- Federal Medicaid is the path for sustainable funding to build up and provide ongoing mental health services for children in Minnesota schools.

#### HF1175 is a win for the State of Minnesota:

- There is **no cost** to the state; schools are reimbursed with federal Medicaid funds (7).
- The Bipartisan Safer Communities Act expands vital mental health services and provides federal support for states and districts (8).

Therefore, I urge the committee to pass HF1175 and thank you for taking time to review this testimony.
