- ❖ We need more and better data collection and analysis to better evaluate the efficacy of the predatory offender registration system.
- Providing registrants who have established a record of compliance and opportunity to petition for removal from the registry

#### **Examples of Data That Are Needed**

- 1. # of abduction and/or sexual assault cases reported to law enforcement agencies on a yearly basis, and the number of those cases that were investigated using data uniquely available on the registry and unavailable by any other means (traditional investigatory methods);
- 2. # of registrants in the past twenty years whose registration requirements re-started for an additional ten years because they were convicted of a non-registerable offense (broken down by offense level); and
- 3. # of registrants that came onto the registry as juveniles since 1991.

#### ANGELA KIESE, CO-CHAIR ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL

- Registration requirements for juveniles
- Amending restart registration periods to reduce the number of crimes that would trigger restart
- Changing the mandatory minimum provisions so they would not apply to first time failure to register convictions

### TROY HECK, CO-CHAIR BENTON COUNTY SHERIFF

- Same set of circumstances language false imprisonment
- Logistical issues related to registering homeless offenders or those with other difficulties complying with the registration process
