1.11 **(a) DNA Laboratory**

1.12 \$630,000 is for the Bureau of Criminal  
1.13 Apprehension DNA laboratory, including the  
1.14 addition of six forensic scientists. The base  
1.15 for this activity is \$1,000,000 in each of the  
1.16 fiscal years 2018 and 2019 for eight forensic  
1.17 scientists.

1.18 **(b) Children In Need of Services or in**  
1.19 **Out-Of-Home Placement**

1.20 \$150,000 is for a grant to an organization that  
1.21 provides legal representation to children in  
1.22 need of protection or services and children in  
1.23 out-of-home placement. The grant is  
1.24 contingent upon a match in an equal amount

2.1 from nonstate funds. The match may be in  
 2.2 kind, including the value of volunteer attorney  
 2.3 time, or in cash, or in a combination of the  
 2.4 two.

2.5 **(c) Sex Trafficking**

2.6 \$820,000 is for grants to state and local units  
 2.7 of government for the following purposes:

2.8 (1) to support new or existing  
 2.9 multijurisdictional entities to investigate sex  
 2.10 trafficking crimes; and

2.11 (2) to provide technical assistance for sex  
 2.12 trafficking crimes, including ~~training and~~ case  
 2.13 consultation, to law enforcement agencies  
 2.14 statewide.

2.15 **(d) State Patrol**

2.16 \$4,500,000 is from the trunk highway fund to  
 2.17 recruit, hire, train, and equip a State Patrol  
 2.18 Academy. This amount is added to the  
 2.19 appropriation in Laws 2015, chapter 75, article  
 2.20 1, section 5, subdivision 3. The base  
 2.21 appropriation from the trunk highway fund  
 2.22 for patrolling highways in each of fiscal years  
 2.23 2018 and 2019 is \$87,492,000, which includes  
 2.24 \$4,500,000 each year for a State Patrol  
 2.25 Academy.

2.26 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective July 1, 2021.

3.2 Up to 2.5 percent of the grant funds  
3.3 appropriated in this subdivision may be used  
3.4 by the commissioner to administer the grant  
3.5 program.

3.6 **(b) Combating Terrorism Recruitment**

3.7 \$250,000 each year is for grants to local law  
3.8 enforcement agencies to develop strategies  
3.9 and make efforts to combat the recruitment of  
3.10 Minnesota residents by terrorist organizations  
3.11 such as ISIS and al-Shabaab. This is a onetime  
3.12 appropriation.

3.13 **(c) Sex Trafficking Prevention Grants**

3.14 \$180,000 each year is for grants to state and  
3.15 local units of government for the following  
3.16 purposes:

3.17 (1) to support new or existing  
3.18 multijurisdictional entities to investigate sex  
3.19 trafficking crimes; and

3.20 (2) to provide technical assistance, including  
3.21 ~~training and~~ case consultation, to law  
3.22 enforcement agencies statewide.

3.23 **(d) Pathway to Policing Reimbursement Grants**

3.24 \$400,000 the second year is for reimbursement  
3.25 grants to local units of government that operate  
3.26 pathway to policing programs intended to  
3.27 bring persons with nontraditional backgrounds  
3.28 into law enforcement. Applicants for  
3.29 reimbursement grants may receive up to 50  
3.30 percent of the cost of compensating and  
3.31 training pathway to policing participants.  
3.32 Reimbursement grants shall be proportionally

4.2 applications approved by the commissioner.
