ISLAND HUB

The Island Hub will be a multi-purpose reuse of the historic Bird Island Elementary School in Bird Island, MN.

Long a treasure of the community, the School District has closed the school, moving all students to its second campus in Olivia. It will engage in plans to renovate its second campus and possibly portions of the closed Elementary School. This creates an opportunity for a unique community collaboration between the Bird Island Cultural Centre, Rural Computer Consultants, Developing Roots and the School District. This one-of-a-kind public/private partnership will foster school sports, student learning, business expansion, event space, community wellness and arts programs for residents and visitors throughout Central Renville County.

Bird Island has a rich cultural heritage of supporting the arts and creative sectors along with sports and business. The Island Hub will literally be a hub as well as a center of commerce for the entire community. This will be an employment center, a place to take classes, a place to hold family reunions, weddings and the like, a place for fitness and wellness and a place to learn about and purchase healthy locally grown foods year-round.

The Vision for the Island Hub

Create business opportunities for the community

Address health and wellness needs of the community (youth, adults and seniors)

Community resiliency

Provide spaces that are needed long-term, i.e. community kitchen, large community event gathering space(s)

Host extra-curricular activities that complement the school, i.e. gym, theater, dance, volleyball

Offer the opportunity to preserve a community asset so that it can provide things that help attract former residents back

Preserve places and spaces for young entrepreneurs and trailing spouses

Transform a vacant building into a community asset to stabilize the population

Provide space to allow expansion of art programming and other cultural center programs

PRIMARY PROJECT PARTNERS



CULTURAL CENTRE IN BIRD ISLAND

Serves as the community hub for the arts and has been in operation since 2017. The Cultural Centre provides classes, hosts special art events and gallery exhibitions for all ages. The Island Hub project provides an opportunity to expand the Cultural Centre's offerings and include fitness and wellness as part of the mix that will meet the growing needs of the community.

RURAL COMPUTER CONSULTANTS, INC.

RCC's primary goal and purpose is to create, maintain and enhance quality, affordable, complete and where-ever feasible, self-supporting software packages, that are consistent and easy to use, and meet the needs of industry specific customers. Rural Computer Consultants was founded by the Sheehan family in the 1970s and continues as a family-owned and managed company employing more than 70 people with a majority living and working in Central Renville County. The Island Hub project provides an opportunity to expand their business to employ an additional 10-15 people and to create a collaborative workspace for the community.





DEVELOPING ROOTS

Developing Roots' founder, Leta Jacobs, is an experienced vegetable and plant grower having grown edible and ornamental plants much of her life. The Island Hub project provides an opportunity for her to expand capacity with the addition of a deep winter and traditional greenhouse space; as well as community education and gathering space. In turn, bolstering the ability to expand plant sales, provide local fresh produce to the community and offer an indoor gathering space year-round. Exciting new collaborations with local seed companies have also opened new opportunity for year-round education and food production.

BOLD SCHOOL DISTRICT

BOLD School District will continue to make use of the large gymnasium space for after-school activities after its Olivia campus is renovated.

GOVERNANCE, PROJECT FUNDING AND TIMELINE

GOVERNANCE

Island Hub, Inc. a newly formed Minnesota 501(c)(3) Nonprofit, has been established to manage the proposed Island Hub building complex.

PROJECT FUNDING

The Island Hub is an approximately \$11.2 million project. The majority of funding will come through a combination of Minnesota State bonding, federal funding, local philanthropy and other local and regional private and public sources.

PROJECT TIMING

The project is currently in predevelopment. The School District plans to vacate or possibly renovate portions of the building in the Summer of 2023. The Island Hub is expected to start construction in 2024, with completion expected by early 2025.
