WHO WE ARE

Minnesota Transportation Museum (MTM) is located at the historic Jackson Street Roundhouse. Located near downtown Saint Paul just north and east of the State Capitol, the building was originally built in 1907 and was a steam engine maintenance facility for The Great Northern Railroad. MTM took possession of the Roundhouse in 1986 and turned it to a museum in 1999.

Justus Ramsey House

The Justus Ramsey Stone House was one of the oldest known houses still standing in Saint Paul and has listed on the National Register of Historic Places since 1975. The stone house was also home to a long line of men who worked as Pullman Porters for the lines running through the St. Paul Union Depot. Last year, MTM was selected to become the new home to the historic stone house.

New home

MTM has debuted its "Twin Tracks" exhibit. This exhibit examines the working lives of local African American railroad industry workers, where the home life of their families can be told with the presence of the historic stone house present.
