1.8 to lead. A district or charter school must base the plan on the United States Environmental
1.9 Protection Agency's "Ensuring Drinking Water Quality in Schools During and After Extended
1.10 Closures" fact sheet and United States Environmental Protection Agency's "3Ts Toolkit for
1.11 Reducing Lead in Drinking Water in Schools and Child Care Facilities." A district or charter
1.12 school's plan must be publicly available upon request."

- 2.19 lines, meters, galvanized service lines downstream of lead, or lead connectors."

- 2.29 Act lead action level or is in violation of the Safe Drinking Water Act Lead and Copper
