### Multimodal Transportation Package Small Cities Assistance

- \$10 million general funds annually to ensure funding for cities that do <u>not</u> receive municipal state aid funds
- Funding for construction and maintenance in cities with a population less than 5,000
  - 700+ eligible cities

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Train from Twin Cities to Chicago



- Funding for <u>operational</u> costs for Twin Cities to Chicago passenger rail corridor
  - **\$740,000** in FY2023 and **\$3.69** million in FY2024-25
- FRA awarded a \$12.6 million grant to offset operations for the first 3 years
- Beginning FY2026, state responsible for 100% of the operational costs
  - Minnesota's share is approximately \$4 million

### IIJA Overview FFY2022 Appropriations

- March 11: Congress passes full year FY22 appropriations
- March 12: Appropriations signed into law
  - Appropriations now consistent with IIJA provisions, <u>plus</u> \$3.5 billion in additional funding for the Transportation-Housing Subcommittee
  - Earmarks \$1.45 billion, <u>\$847 million for FHWA</u>
  - Additional Funding for Highways \$1.1 billion extra for formula-based bridge program
  - Additional funding for Grant Programs adds \$775 million to FY2022 RAISE Grant program, new total of \$2.25 B.

### • \$250 million for competitive resilience grants under the new PROTECT program

### IIJA State and Local Match (current estimates)

#### All amounts in table below reflect rough estimates in millions:
