#### **EXPANDING A REGIONAL ASSET**

The North Metro Regional Public Safety Training Facility is a highly sought-after state-of-the-art regional asset; whereby, local, county, state and federal law enforcement agencies along with post-secondary law enforcement institutions are all vying for time and space at the facility.

### The expansion includes:

- Additional classroom space for de-escalation and crisis intervention training
- Simunition space for scenario-based training
- Dedicated space for a state-of-the-art decision simulation lab
- Increased firearms training lanes
- Storage space

State bonding in the amount of \$3.5 million was received in support of the project during the 2020 legislative session, and the project is currently under construction. The City of Maple Grove, Hennepin County, and the JPA users of the facility are funding the balance of the \$17.5 million project. The taxable materials are estimated at \$4.5 million with an exemption impact of \$300,000. The City of Maple Grove is requesting a sales tax exemption for this public safety training facility project.
