funding to design a 15,000 square
foot global environmental learning
center expansion and improvements to
inspire curiosity, care and respect for
nature.

PROFILE: Each year, River Bend Nature Center provides environmental learning and career training in natural resources for over 5,000 participants and our 743 acre nature preserve hosts over 100,000 visits annually. Our youth educational and enrichment programs serve approximately 60% BIPOC learners and about half of all our youth qualify for free or reduced lunch.



HISTORY: The human history of the grounds of the nature center is a complicated tapestry of people. Much of the land that is now River Bend Nature Center, was the home of the Faribault Regional Center- the states first and one of largest institutions for the care of people with physical and cognitive disabilities. For a century, thousands of Minnesotans lived on and died on the land. These histories have been largely erased from the landscape and these stories, and more, deserved to be told through an inclusive interpretive plan and exhibits in an expanded center.

TODAY: People from all over the globe settle in Faribault for the promise of a better life. River Bend Nature Center is the

region's best and closest opportunity to build meaningful connections with nature for all Minnesotans. River Bend Nature Center provides environmental education and natural resource career path training for nearly all school age children across Rice County but today, our capacity to serve is inhibited by limited classroom and interpretive spaces. An investment from the Minnesota Legislature will help River Bend Nature Center design and build a world-class environmental education center for the region and state.
