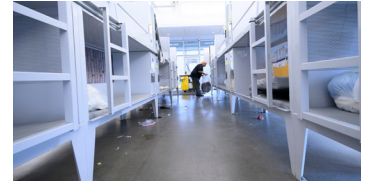

EMERGENCY SHELTER

YOUTH SERVICES

Hope Street for Homeless Youth

A unique program in the region that offers the full continuum of services for youth, from prevention to crisis support and pathways to stability.

- **Emergency Shelter** offers intensive case management services for 28 youth ages 18–20 experiencing homelessness or escaping abusive situations or street life. Provides food, clothing, medical care and independent living skills.
- **Transitional Living Program** for 12 homeless male-identified youth, ages 16–21, providing basic needs, case management, independent living skills and goal setting.
- **Permanent Supportive Housing Program** provides scattered-site housing support and case management to 12 disabled, homeless and chronically homeless youth and single parent households ages 18–24.
