Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB)



- CAAPB authorized under MN Statute 15B
- Zoning and Regulatory Roles in MN Rules Chapter 2400
- Planning and Zoning Authority for 60block Capitol Area (instead of St. Paul)
- 12-member Board (Lt. Governor as Board chair, 2 Senators, 2 Representatives, 4 Governor appointees; 3 City of St. Paul appointees)
- 2.5 FTE (Executive Secretary, Principal Planner and Zoning Administrator, parttime Office Assistant
- 3 Architectural Advisors to the Board

CAAPB Roles and Responsibilities




Joint authority with MN Historical Society for all changes and renovations to the Capitol building

Planning and Approval for Capitol Mall design, landscape and memorials




Comprehensive Planning for 60-block Capitol Area Zoning & Permitting for State, public and private land uses and development in the Capitol Area

Capitol Area Community Vitality Task Force

Prepare plan for community vitality and economic development in the Capitol Area that improves its livability, economic health, safety. Focus efforts on community wealth building.

\$150,000 to support task force work (economic development consultants and public engagement)

Proposed Task Force composition


- CAAPB Executive Secretary of the Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board;
- CAAP Board member
- 2 House Representatives appointed by Speaker (1 each from majority and minority caucus)
- 2 Senators appointed by Majority Leader (1 each from majority caucus and minority caucus)
- 4 Capitol Area residents, businesspeople, or members of local organizations appointed by the mayor of Saint Paul
- 1 member of the public appointed by the governor.

Capitol Area Community Vitality Fund and Transportation Corridors

Special revenue fund to improve the livability, economic health, and safety of communities within the Capitol Area.

\$5,000,000 for community development investments + \$5,000,000 for transportation investments, based on recommendations of Capitol Area Community Vitality Task Force.
