

The Supplemental Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP) protects vulnerable communities from threats through security enhancements.

Minnesota receives less than 2 percent share of federal dollars in this program (Roughly \$8 million out of \$454 million in FY2024), so we need supplemental state dollars to close the gap.

How the Supplemental NSGP works in Minnesota

Non-profit organizations submit an extensive application to the Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM) division of MN Department of Public Safety.

HSEM forwards the application to FEMA, which reviews and determines which applicants receive federal funds.

Once notified of an awarded grant, organizations expend funds on security enhancements and are reimbursed by State of Minnesota.

Additional Minnesota applicants, who didn't receive federal awards, are automatically eligible to receive state funds for the same projects.

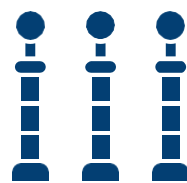

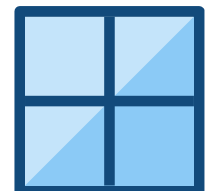

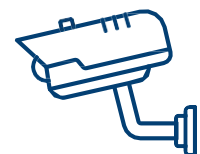
