MICC has been an important part of the Richfield community since its founding in 1996, providing vocational and life training services to young adults on the autism spectrum or with similar learning differences. MICC is outgrowing its current facility located within a Richfield apartment complex and is seeking a permanent home nearby for its offices and classrooms, as well as housing for program graduates and others in need of affordable housing.

In Minnesota, autism is one of the fastest growing disabilities within the educational system. From 2009 – 2020, the percentage of students diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) was up 138% (MN Dept. Of Education Data). Once students age out of the public school system at age 21, there are very few options for adults who need more support and guidance. The MICC project offers a unique opportunity to holistically support this learning community.
