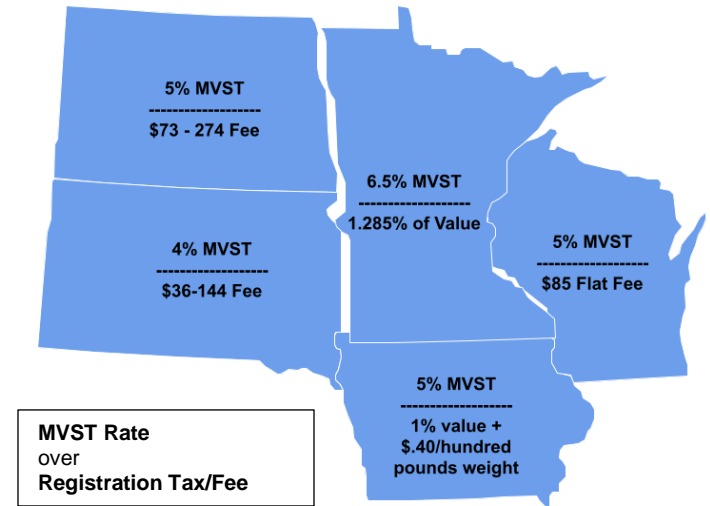


# Minnesota car buyers already *PAY MORE* than car buyers in the surrounding states:

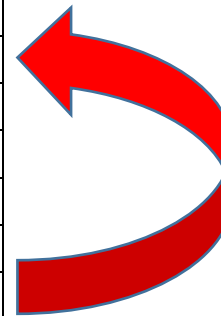
Compare state taxes on a **NEW 2021 Ford 150** with MSRP of \$28,940:

South Dakota	\$1,157.60	\$108.00	\$1,265.60	44% higher



House File 1648 adds to the burden by increasing the motor vehicle sales tax rate by another 0.375% to 6.875%, making Minnesota's rate one of the top-five highest in the country!
