Safe Harbor Bill HF 3599 | SF 3470

Funding: Increase of \$20 Million

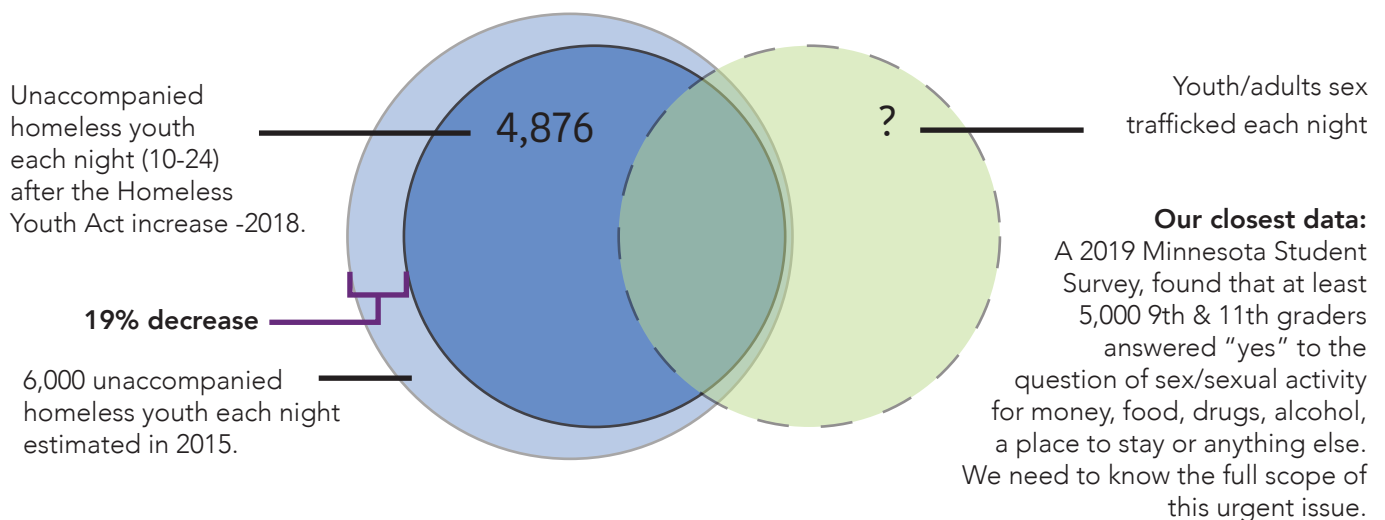
\$9 Million for sustaining and expanding street outreach, emergency shelter and housing; \$2 Million for sustaining and expanding Safe Harbor Regional Navigators and \$9 Million for Safe Harbor Supportive Services

Safe Harbor will:

- Provide survivors with safety and trauma-informed care
- Prevent further victimization
- Support Mental health & substance abuse counseling
- Create opportunities for employment and education success
