1.19 (a) The commissioner must report on the office's website summary data on students  
1.20 who, within the most recent academic year, withdrew from enrollment without completing  
1.21 a degree or credential program at a public postsecondary institution in Minnesota. The  
1.22 summary data must include whether the students who withdrew transferred to another  
1.23 institution and the institutions transferred to and from.

2.1 (b) Summary data must be aggregated by postsecondary institution and degree or  
2.2 credential program. Summary data must be disaggregated by race, ethnicity, Pell eligibility,  
2.3 and age.

2.4 (c) The commissioner must post the initial data on the office's website on or before  
2.5 February 15, 2022, and must update the data at least annually thereafter."

2.7 "Sec. 39. **STUDY AND REPORT ON THE WORK-STUDY PROGRAM.**

2.8 (a) The commissioner of the Office of Higher Education must conduct a study of the  
2.9 work-study program under Minnesota Statutes, sections 136A.231 to 136A.233. The study  
2.10 must analyze how the program could be expanded to meet the needs of college students and  
2.11 enable more students to work on campus. The study should include an assessment of:

2.12 (1) the interplay between state, federal, and institutional work-study programs and funds;

2.13 (2) the impact of minimum wage laws and ordinances on the program;

2.14 (3) the ability of the program to require a wage for student workers that is higher than  
2.15 the prevailing minimum wage set by law;

2.16 (4) the number of hours students should be working on campus; and

2.17 (5) options for legislative and administrative actions to expand the work-study program  
2.18 along with the anticipated costs of those actions.

2.19 (b) By January 15, 2023, the commissioner shall report to the legislature as provided in  
2.20 Minnesota Statutes, section 3.195, and to the chairs and ranking minority members of the  
2.21 legislative committees with jurisdiction over higher education on the results of the study."
