

**Subject** Eliminating certain juvenile fines and allowing restorative programs in place of some restitution payments

## Overview

In 2023, the legislature created the Office of Restorative Practices to oversee and support restorative practices initiatives at the local level.

This bill allows courts to order that a juvenile who commits an offense participate in a restorative process instead of paying restitution to a victim. It also eliminates the requirement that courts impose fines on juveniles found to be delinquent, a major highway or water traffic offender, or a petty offender. The bill authorizes the Office of Restorative Practices to issue grants to provide restitution funds that allow a victim of a juvenile offense to obtain monetary compensation to satisfy the restitution obligations of a child who participates in a restorative program.

Section	Description
1	<b>Court order, findings, remedies, treatment.</b> Authorizes courts to allow a juvenile found to be delinquent to participate in a restorative process in place of paying financial restitution to a victim. Eliminates the requirement that a court impose a fine on a juvenile found to be delinquent.
2	<b>Juvenile major highway or water traffic offender.</b> Authorizes courts to allow a juvenile found to be a major highway or water traffic offender to participate in a restorative process in place of paying financial restitution to a victim. Eliminates the requirement that a court impose a fine on a juvenile found to be a major highway or water traffic offender.
3	<b>Dispositions.</b> Eliminates the requirement that a court impose a fine on a juvenile found to be a petty offender. Authorizes courts to allow a juvenile found to be a petty offender to participate in a restorative process in place of paying financial restitution to a victim.

4	<p data-bbox="316 262 414 300"><b>Grants.</b></p> <p data-bbox="316 310 1430 459">Authorizes the Office of Restorative Practices to award grants to provide restitution funds that allow a victim of a juvenile offense, juvenile petty offense, or major traffic offense committed by a juvenile to obtain monetary compensation to satisfy the restitution obligations of a child who participates in a restorative program.</p>
