### Overview

This bill makes clarifying changes to state statutes governing the licensure of athletic trainers.

## Summary

Section	Description
1	<b>Athletic training.</b> Adds a subdivision to § 148.7802. Adds a definition of “athletic training” to statutes governing licensure of athletic trainers.
2	<b>Athletic training.</b> Amends § 148.7806. Requires that an athletic trainer provide athletic training under the direction of, on the prescription of, or in collaboration with a primary physician who is licensed in Minnesota. Specifies that an athletic trainer must use therapeutic interventions within the trainer’s experience and training pursuant to evaluation and treatment protocols established by a primary physician. Makes changes to how an athletic trainer may treat a patient.
3	<b>Limitations on practice.</b> Amends § 148.7807. Provides specific limitations on what an athletic trainer may practice or claim to practice.
4	<b>Applicability.</b> Amends § 148.7814. Provides that Minnesota’s athletic trainer licensure requirements do not apply to an athletic trainer who is in Minnesota temporarily for a specific athletic event and who is licensed, certified, or registered by another state or county or is certified as an athletic trainer by the Board of Certification.
5	<b>Repealer.</b> Repeals § 148.7802, subdivisions 4 (definition of athlete) and 5 (definition of athletic injury).
