I am writing in regard to the Board of Dentistry's proposed revisions to Minnesota Statute 150A.091 subdivisions 2, 4, 5, 8, and 9. The proposed changes are primarily technical in nature and as such our organization has no objection to the changes as presented.

Furthermore, the addition of subdivisions 21 and 22 provide the Board of Dentistry with an opportunity to pursue administrative action for lapsed licenses rather than pursuing the immediate opening of a formal complaint. We believe that affording this latitude is most appropriate and our organization has no objection to the changes as presented.

With regards to proposed changes in Minnesota Statute 150A.10 subdivision 4, our organization has no objection. It is our understanding that the placing, contouring, and adjusting of class I, II, III, IV, and V composite restorations are taught in the requisite training programs and may only be performed as enumerated in 150A.10 subdivision 4 (b).
