Bill Description

HF717-0 amends Minn. Stat. § 541.073 and Minn. Stat. § 573.02 to eliminate the current statutes of limitations for bringing an action for damages in cases involving an alleged sexual assault by a peace officer or an alleged act by a peace officer that results in a wrongful death. This bill provides for retroactive application, but only for otherwise time-barred actions if brought within 5 years of the effective date of this legislation.

Assumptions

It is assumed the effective date is August 1, 2021.

It is assumed the provisions of this bill will result in the filing of civil cases for damages that under the current provisions could not be filed.

It is assumed the number of instances of peace officers committing sexual assault or causing death are statistically rare. It is further assumed that in these types of cases, most actions for damages are filed within the applicable limitations period. It is unknown how many additional cases will be filed as a result of the bill but it is not anticipated to be a significant increase in the case filing rate.

This bill is not anticipated to have a significant fiscal impact on the judicial branch.

Bill Description

This bill eliminates the statute of limitations for actions for damages around alleged sexual abuse by a peace officer and death caused by a peace officer. It also permits actions that might otherwise have been time barred to commence within 5 years following the day of enactment.

Assumptions

BCA:

The BCA cannot know how many actions were not filed due to the current statute of limitations, therefore, the BCA cannot know how many would be filed in response to its' elimination. Therefore, the BCA cannot claim an impact as there is no data to support it.

However, it is important to note that the elimination of the statute of limitations could lead to increased costs associated with defense of the BCA in court, though these costs cannot be estimated.

AGED & MSP:

There is no fiscal impact to the State Patrol or Alcohol and Gambling Enforcement divisions.
