1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 144.057, subdivision 1, is amended to read:				
1.7	Subdivision 1. Background studies required. (a) Except as specified in paragraph (b),				
1.8	the commissioner of health shall contract with the commissioner of human services to				
1.9	conduct background studies of:				
1.10	(1) individuals providing services that have direct contact, as defined under section				
1.11	245C.02, subdivision 11, with patients and residents in hospitals, boarding care homes,				
1.12	outpatient surgical centers licensed under sections 144.50 to 144.58; nursing homes and				
1.13	home care agencies licensed under chapter 144A; assisted living facilities and assisted living				
1.14	facilities with dementia care licensed under chapter 144G; and board and lodging				
1.15	establishments that are registered to provide supportive or health supervision services under				
1.16	section 157.17;				
1.17	(2) individuals specified in section 245C.03, subdivision 1, who perform direct contact				
1.18	services in a nursing home or a home care agency licensed under chapter 144A; an assisted				
1.19	living facility or assisted living facility with dementia care licensed under chapter 144G;

2.7	contact or access to patients or residents receiving services. "Access" means physical access
2.8	to a client or the client's personal property without continuous, direct supervision as defined
2.9	in section 245C.02, subdivision 8, when the employee's employment responsibilities do not
2.10	include providing direct contact services;
2.11	(4) individuals employed by a supplemental nursing services agency, as defined under
2.12	section 144A.70, who are providing services in health care facilities; and
2.13	(5) controlling persons of a supplemental nursing services agency, as defined under
2.14	section 144A.70.
2.15	(b) The commissioner of human services is not required to conduct a background study
2.16	on any individual identified in paragraph (a) if the individual has a valid license issued by
2.17	a health-related licensing board as defined in section 214.01, subdivision 2, and has completed
2.18	the criminal background check as required in section 214.075, unless the commissioner of
2.19	human services has reasonable cause as defined in section 245C.02, subdivision 15, to
2.20	conduct a background study.
2.21	(c) If a facility or program is licensed by the Department of Human Services and subject
2.22	to the background study provisions of chapter 245C and is also licensed by the Department
2.23	of Health, the Department of Human Services is solely responsible for the background

4.29 section 245C.05, subdivision 5a, paragraph (d), for licensed family child care, certified
4.30 license-exempt child care, licensed child care centers, and legal nonlicensed child care
4.31 authorized under chapter 119B, information obtained using non-fingerprint-based data

(7) for a background study required for family child care, certified license-exempt child
care centers, licensed child care centers, and legal nonlicensed child care authorized under
chapter 119B, the background study shall also include, to the extent practicable, a name
and date-of-birth search of the National Sex Offender Public website.

(b) Notwithstanding expungement by a court, the commissioner may consider information
obtained under paragraph (a), clauses (3) and (4), unless the commissioner received notice
of the petition for expungement and the court order for expungement is directed specifically
to the commissioner.

(c) The commissioner shall also review criminal case information received according
to section 245C.04, subdivision 4a, from the Minnesota court information system that relates
to individuals who have already been studied under this chapter and who remain affiliated
with the agency that initiated the background study.

(d) When the commissioner has reasonable cause to believe that the identity of a
background study subject is uncertain, the commissioner may require the subject to provide
a set of classifiable fingerprints for purposes of completing a fingerprint-based record check
with the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension. Fingerprints collected under this paragraph
shall not be saved by the commissioner after they have been used to verify the identity of
the background study subject against the particular criminal record in question.

(e) The commissioner may inform the entity that initiated a background study under
NETStudy 2.0 of the status of processing of the subject's fingerprints.
