Description from Private Detectives Board website:

The mission of the Private Detective and Protective Agent Services Board is to ensure investigative and security service practitioners meet statutory qualifications and training for licensure, and maintain standards set forth in Minnesota Statutes and Administrative Rules. The Board is a five-member panel, comprised of one licensed private detective, one licensed protective agent, one law enforcement representative, and two public members. The Board oversees more than 300 investigative and security license holders.

Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Board General Fund Base \$11,131,000

The POST board is the organization responsible for regulating training and licensing of law enforcement officers in the State of Minnesota. While the board sets training standards and creates model policies, it also administers training reimbursement funds to local law enforcement agencies as well.

Department of Corrections (DOC)

General Fund Base \$628,629,000

The Department of Corrections is the agency responsible for operation state correctional facilities that house felony level offenders. The department is responsible for vocational, educational and rehabilitation programs to incarcerated individuals and also works in conjunction with local jurisdictions on offender supervision during probation or after offender release. The agency operates 11 facilities throughout the state.
