Bill Description

This bill would modify Minn. Stat. 299E.01 to include training requirements for all State Troopers assigned to the Capitol Complex. It would also provide language to clarify the primary agency as the Capitol Security Division for the investigation of criminal offenses that occur within the Capitol Area. Additionally, and if warranted, it would outline the requirements of transferring any investigative responsibility to another agency.

Assumptions

Minn. Stat. 299E.01, Subd. 2 (c) states that all sworn state personnel assigned to the Capitol Complex must have current training in, or recent experience conducting, criminal investigations that include identifying witnesses and report writing. Prior to be assigned to the Capitol, it is assumed that all State Troopers have current training within report writing, the identification of witnesses, and criminal investigations through Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) licensing requirements. Past practice within the division has allowed Troopers assigned to the Capitol Area to attend applicable training sessions and that has also permitted the agency to internally train on these investigative topics. However, it is assumed that criminal investigations which take place on the Capitol Complex may be specialized or unique and the State Patrol would be committed to providing additional applicable training in those areas within the current operational funding with no fiscal impact.

Minn. Stat. 299E.01, Subd. 2 (e) assigns the Capitol Security division as the lead agency for investigating criminal offenses in the Capitol Area and, if needed, also allows for the reassignment of investigative responsibilities to be transferred to another law enforcement agency. It is assumed that this transfer of investigate responsibility would occur on a case-by-case basis with considerations given to the severity of the event and the subject matter expertise of the investigative agency it would be transferred to. There would also be no fiscal impact for the agency with this inclusion.
