2.5 **TESTING FOR PRIVATE WELLS; EAST METROPOLITAN AREA.**

2.6 Subdivision 1. **Definitions.** (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms have
2.7 the meanings given.

2.8 (b) "East metropolitan area" means:

2.9 (1) the cities of Afton, Cottage Grove, Lake Elmo, Maplewood, Newport, Oakdale, St.
2.10 Paul Park, and Woodbury;

2.11 (2) the townships of Denmark, Grey Cloud Island, and West Lakeland; and

2.12 (3) other areas added by the commissioner that have a potential for significant
2.13 groundwater pollution from ~~PFCs~~ PFAS.

2.14 (c) "~~PFCs~~" "PFAS" means ~~per- and poly-fluorinated chemicals~~ perfluoroalkyl and
2.15 polyfluoroalkyl substances.

2.16 Subd. 2. **Testing for private wells.** To provide results of ~~PFC~~ PFAS groundwater
2.17 monitoring to the public, the commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency must develop
2.18 a web page that may include, but is not limited to, the following:

2.19 (1) the process for private and public well ~~PFC~~ PFAS sampling in the east metropolitan
2.20 area;

2.21 (2) an interactive map system that allows the public to view locations of the Department
2.22 of Health well advisories and areas projected to be sampled for ~~PFCs~~ PFAS; and

2.23 (3) how to contact the Pollution Control Agency or Department of Health staff to answer
2.24 questions on sampling of private wells.

2.25 Subd. 3. **Test reporting.** (a) By ~~January~~ February 15 each year, the commissioner of
2.26 the Pollution Control Agency must report to each community in the east metropolitan area
2.27 a summary of the results of the testing for private wells in the community. The report must
2.28 include information on the number of wells tested and trends of ~~PFC~~ PFAS contamination
2.29 in private wells in the community. Reports to communities under this section must also be
2.30 published on the Pollution Control Agency's website.

3.1 (b) By ~~January~~ February 15 each year, the commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency
3.2 must report to the legislature, as provided in section 3.195, on the testing for private wells
3.3 conducted in the east metropolitan area, including copies of the community reports required
3.4 in paragraph (a), the number of requests for well testing in each community, and the total
3.5 amount spent for testing private wells in each community."

3.6 Page 82, delete section 82, and insert:

3.7 "Sec. 82. PIG'S EYE AREA TASK FORCE.

3.8 Subdivision 1. Pig's Eye Area Task Force. The commissioner of the Pollution Control
3.9 Agency must establish a Pig's Eye Area Task Force to coordinate efforts to remediate and
3.10 restore the Pig's Eye Landfill Superfund site, including adjacent contaminated sites, to
3.11 address contaminated groundwater, surface water, and sediments. Contaminants to evaluate
3.12 include, but are not limited to perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) within
3.13 Battle Creek, Pig's Eye Lake, and nearby groundwater. The task force is subject to Minnesota
3.14 Statutes, section 15.059, subdivision 6.

3.15 Subd. 2. Membership. The task force must consist of:

3.16 (1) the commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency or their designee;

3.17 (2) the commissioner of natural resources or their designee;

3.18 (3) the commissioner of health or their designee;

3.19 (4) a representative from the Metropolitan Council;

3.20 (5) a representative from the United States Army Corps of Engineers;

3.21 (6) a representative from the United States Coast Guard;

3.22 (7) a representative from the federal Environmental Protection Agency;

3.23 (8) a representative from the National Park Service;

3.24 (9) a representative from the United States Fish and Wildlife Service;

3.25 (10) a representative from the Ramsey-Washington Metro Watershed District;

3.26 (11) one representative from each of the following local governments:

3.27 (i) Newport;

3.28 (ii) St. Paul;

3.29 (iii) South St. Paul;

4.1 (iv) Dakota County;

4.2 (v) Ramsey County; and

4.3 (vi) Washington County; and

4.4 (12) three members of the public.

4.5 Subd. 3. **Organization.** (a) By January 15, 2023, the commissioner or the commissioner's
4.6 designee must convene the first meeting of the task force.

4.7 (b) The task force must meet monthly or as determined by the chair. Meetings of the
4.8 task force must be open to the public.

4.9 (c) The members of the task force must annually elect a chair, vice chair, and other
4.10 officers as the members deem necessary.

4.11 Subd. 4. **Staff.** The commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency must provide support
4.12 staff, office space, and administrative services for the task force.

4.13 Subd. 5. **Reports.** Beginning in 2024, by February 15 each year, the commissioner of
4.14 the Pollution Control Agency must submit an annual report to the chairs and ranking minority
4.15 members of the legislative committees and divisions with jurisdiction over the environment
4.16 and natural resources on the status of the task force's work. The final report, due February
4.17 15, 2026, must:

4.18 (1) summarize the history of the Pig's Eye Landfill, including cleanup efforts and impacts;

4.19 (2) include a coordinated plan to:

4.20 (i) cleanup and remediate the contamination;

4.21 (ii) restore and enhance wildlife habitat;

4.22 (iii) prevent future water contamination; and

4.23 (iv) address existing water quality issues;

4.24 (3) identify infrastructure needs;

4.25 (4) identify potential funding sources; and

4.26 (5) include any recommendations for legislative action.

4.27 Subd. 6. **Sunset.** The task force expires June 30, 2026."

5.3 The commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency may phase-in the new financial
5.4 assurance requirements under Minnesota Statutes, section 116.07, subdivision 7f, during
5.5 the next reissuance of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System General Permit
5.6 for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations, MNG440000. The commissioner of the
5.7 Pollution Control Agency must establish a schedule for permittees to come into compliance
5.8 with the requirements. The schedule must require 250 permittees per year to comply starting
5.9 with the operations with the largest number of animal units."
