
Registered Teacher Apprenticeship Programs Nationally

Registered Teacher Apprenticeship Program Grant

Purpose

- Administer K-12 registered teacher apprenticeship programs statewide

Eligible expenses

- Personnel
- Related instruction
- Equipment, training materials, and software licenses
- Marketing
- Subawards to signatory school districts

Grant Program Details

- Up to \$3 million was available for each applicant
- Timeline
 - Sept. 2, 2025: Grant application period opened
 - Sept. 26, 2025: Application period closed
 - Jan. 27, 2026: Grant recipients announced
 - March 1, 2026, to Dec. 31, 2027: Estimated grant period of performance

Registered Teacher Apprenticeship Program Grantees

- Minneapolis Public Schools
 - \$878,904
- Teacher Apprenticeship Minnesota
 - \$2.6 million
- Minnesota Teacher Apprenticeship Joint Training Committee
 - \$3 million

 - Hopkins Public Schools

- Licensure Area
 - Elementary Education

 - Academic and Behavioral Strategist
 - Elementary/Pre-Primary Education




Minnesota Teacher Joint Apprenticeship Training Committee

Grant Program Outcomes
