Dear Chairpersons Dibble and Hornstien,

I write to the Legislature today as a private citizen and in support of passage of S.F. 1417 and H.F. 1272, Minimum Train Crew Requirement.

After all parties have listed their policy positions and financial claims regarding railroad industry safety before you and the greater Legislature, I believe there is one question, the essential question, that all legislators must consider when casting your vote:

After public vehicle and train collisions at grade-crossings across Minnesota, is the state of Minnesota going to allow private railroad carriers to leave injured persons unattended on the carrier right-of ways, in the ditches, of Minnesota?

Train crews are actual and unfortunate participants during grade-crossing collisions. We are the initial responders and provide immediate first aid to the injured. We control the accident site and assist the emergency first responders after they arrive. From a forty year career as a railroad train-person, conductor, yardmaster, and remote-control locomotive operator, and veteran of seven grade-crossing collisions with the general public, please accept my highest encouragement for the Legislature to fulfill your responsibility to protect the safety of the general public first.
