1.4 "Sec. 11. Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 122A.441, is amended to read:

1.5 **122A.441 SHORT-CALL SUBSTITUTE TEACHER PILOT PROGRAM.**

1.6 (a) A school district or charter school and applicant may jointly request the Professional  
1.7 Educator Licensing and Standards Board approve an application for a short-call substitute  
1.8 teaching license. The application information must sufficiently demonstrate the following:

1.9 (1) the applicant:

1.10 (i) holds a minimum of an associate's degree or equivalent and has or will receive  
1.11 substitute training from the school district or charter school; or

1.12 (ii) holds a minimum of a high school diploma or equivalent and has been employed as  
1.13 an education support personnel or paraprofessional within the district or charter school for  
1.14 at least one academic year; and

1.15 (2) the school district or charter school has obtained the results of a background check  
1.16 completed in accordance with section 123B.03.

1.17 (b) The Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board may issue a temporary  
1.18 teaching license under this section pending a background check under section 122A.18,  
1.19 subdivision 8, and may immediately suspend or revoke the license upon receiving background  
1.20 check information. An applicant submitting an application for a short-call substitute teaching  
1.21 license in accordance with section 122A.18, subdivision 7a, paragraph (a), must not be  
1.22 required to complete a joint application with a district and must not be issued a license  
1.23 pending a background check under section 122A.18, subdivision 8.

2.1 (c) The board may prioritize short-call substitute teaching license applications to expedite  
2.2 the review process.

2.3 (d) A school district or charter school must provide a substitute teacher who receives a  
2.4 substitute teaching license through the pilot program with substitute teacher training. The  
2.5 board may remove a school district or charter school from the pilot program for failure to  
2.6 provide the required training.

2.7 (e) A school district or charter school must not require an employee to apply for a  
2.8 substitute teaching license, or retaliate against an employee that does not apply for a substitute  
2.9 teaching license under the pilot program.

2.10 (f) A school district or charter school must compensate an employee working as a  
2.11 short-call substitute teacher under the pilot program with ~~the~~ either the same rate of pay as  
2.12 other short-call substitute teachers in the school district or charter school or the employee's  
2.13 existing rate of pay, whichever is greater of \$200 per day or the employee's regular rate of  
2.14 pay.

2.15 (g) This section expires on June 30, 2025.

2.16 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."
