

Subject Medication repository
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Overview

Under the medication repository program, a medication repository is permitted to accept donated drugs and medical supplies and distribute these drugs and supplies to individuals who meet certain eligibility requirements. This bill clarifies the donated drugs and supplies for which a medication repository must maintain a record of destruction and modifies the allowable uses of fiscal year 2026 and 2027 appropriations for the medication repository program.

Amends § 151.555, subd. 7. Clarifies that a medication repository must maintain a record of destruction for donated drugs and supplies that are accepted by the medication repository, and is not required to maintain a record of destruction for donated drugs and supplies not accepted by the repository. |

Amends Laws 2025, First Special Session ch. 3, art. 23, § 2, subd. 12. Expands the allowable uses of money appropriated in fiscal years 2026 and 2027 for the medication repository program, to allow money to be used for other costs of administering the central repository, including but not limited to costs related to mail-order dispensing and developing delivery infrastructure. |
