Significant Flooding Problems




In recent years, there has been an **increase** in major flood events along the Minnesota River with **more** anticipated for the future.



Solving the Problem

The current 54-year-old levee that protects Carver's historic downtown was removed from the Army Corp Levee Safety Program in 2016 due to its state of disrepair. To protect the city's vitality for future generations and to increase safety for Carver residents and visitors the levee requires repairs.

Repairing the levee will make the City of Carver safer. It will protect the historic district from future flood damages.





Number of buildings that would be **SAVED FROM THE FLOODPLAIN**


