- Added webinar recordings, articles, recipes and seasonal gardening projects to our online Resource Hub.
- Supplied replacement plants for gardens and flower boxes damaged during the spring protests.
- Helped thousands of new growers start "victory gardens" to feed themselves and their neighbors.

- Launched our first digital gardening competition in the wake of a cancelled State Fair.


