CDC	Emerging Infections Program: COVID19 Surveillance and Reporting	2,650,000	For required data tracking and reporting to CDC's Emerging Infection Network due to pandemic surveillance. Supports preparation and reporting for the 10 designated EIP states for the increase due to COVID-19.
CDC	Sexual Violence Prevention - CARES Act	59,146	Grants to address increase in acts of sexual violence that occur during a pandemic. Supports preparation for and response to the increase due to COVID-19.
CDC	Suicide Prevention and Adverse Childhood Events - CARES Act	173,913	Grants and staffing for comprehensive injury and violence prevention and control activities focused on suicide and adverse childhood events prevention. Supports preparation for and response to the increase due to COVID-19.
CDC	Immunization and Vaccines for Children - COVID-19 Supplement	2,392,636	Vaccination readiness grants to local public health, tribal governments, community organizations, and UMN, supplies and staffing.
CDC	Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC) - Enhanced Detection, Response, Surveillance, and Prevention of COVID-19 [Four grants]	145,583,516	Supports a broad range of COVID-19 testing and epidemiologic surveillance related activities; optimizing testing and increasing test volumes, and supports the establishment of modernized public health surveillance systems. Enhance laboratory, surveillance, informatics and workforce capacity; strengthen laboratory testing; advanced electronic data exchange at public health labs; improve surveillance and reporting of electronic health data; use of laboratory data to enhance investigation, response and prevention; and, ordinate and engage with partners.
CDC	Public Health Emergency Preparedness/Public Health Crisis Response	10,048,124	For preparedness activities including grants and staffing for community resilience, incident management, information management, countermeasures and mitigation, surge management, and surveillance.
HHS	Hospital Preparedness Program – CARES Act, and U.S. Healthcare Systems Response to COVID-19 Supplemental awards (four grants)	3,670,770	Grants to local communities, 8 Regional Health Care Coalitions, Mayo Clinic, staffing and testing supplies. Augment ongoing support for hospitals and other related health care entities to prepare for the identification, isolation, assessment, transportation, and treatment of patients with COVID-19 or persons under investigation (PUIs) for COVID-19, to prepare for future disease outbreaks, improve surveillance and reporting of electronic health data and strengthening laboratory testing.
HRSA	Small Rural Hospital Improvement (SHIP) - COVID-19 Supplement (CARES Act)	7,251,262	Grants to hospitals for providing flexibility in how they respond to COVID-19 within their communities, including the provision of testing and laboratory services as well as the purchase of personal protective equipment to minimize COVID-19 exposure.
