

SECONDS MATTER DURING AN EMERGENCY SITUATION

PROVIDE LAW ENFORCEMENT ACCESS TO LOCKED SCHOOLS WHEN AND WHERE THEY NEED IT MOST

Law enforcement agencies require quick and safe access to locked doors during active shooter incidents and other hostile events. The U.S. Department of Justice and other national school safety organizations recommend a key box containing external and internal master keys and access cards. For schools that already have provided keys or access cards to law enforcement agencies, a key box is an extra layer of safety as a second means of having keys available.



QUICK ENTRY

- Single-key for law enforcement to use for an entire school district
- Provides access to locked external/internal doors and gates
- Eliminates precious time waiting for breaching equipment or arrival of a facility key holder
- Provides secure storage of master keys, access cards, floor plans, and tourniquets

STRATEGIC PLACEMENT

- Boxes placed in strategic locations on a school's grounds enable access for optimal tactical response while keeping officers safe
- Installation options can be tailored to fit individual needs
- No power is needed for key boxes

SAFE AND SECURE

- Key boxes listed to UL 1037 standards have passed rigorous security testing and eliminate concerns over vandalism of the box
- Eliminates forced entry and costly property damages; and reduces potential injuries to personnel (lowering workers comp claims)
