2.7 "Subd. 4. **Threat assessment, mitigation, and response.** (a) The legislative services
2.8 unit must (1) identify, assess, and investigate threats to the life or safety of a member of the
2.9 legislature, and (2) assist in mitigation of threats that the unit determines are credible. The
2.10 credible threat mitigation responsibilities of the unit include but are not limited to
2.11 coordination with the State Patrol, local law enforcement, the relevant sergeant-at-arms of
2.12 the senate or house of representatives, and other available resources on a security response
2.13 to threats, including provision of personal security and protection for the member when
2.14 warranted by a threat.

2.15 (b) Unless there are exigent circumstances or information that indicates otherwise, the
2.16 unit must prioritize assessment of threats against members of the legislature in the following
2.17 order:

2.18 (1) threats that involved a request for an emergency services response;

2.19 (2) threats that are referred for assessment by the speaker of the house, the minority
2.20 leader of the house, or the majority or minority leader of the senate;

2.21 (3) threats that are specifically referred for assessment by any other member of the
2.22 legislature; and

2.23 (4) threats that are identified by the unit, referred by a member of the legislature where
2.24 a threat assessment is not requested, and gathered from any other source.

2.25 (c) For an imminent credible threat, the commissioner must immediately coordinate a
2.26 response by available law enforcement resources.

2.27 (d) The commissioner may consult with the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension to
2.28 determine whether a threat is credible.

2.29 (e) In response to a request under paragraph (b), clause (2) or (3), the commissioner
2.30 must as soon as practicable provide the subject of a threat, and when appropriate and
2.31 authorized by law, any referring party, with:

- 3.1 (1) an initial estimate on how long the requested threat assessment will take to complete;
- 3.2 (2) an explanation of the unit's threat analysis and determination;
- 3.3 (3) recommendations for mitigating the threat; and
- 3.4 (4) the proposed and intended actions of the unit to implement the recommendations
- 3.5 under clause (3).
- 3.6 (f) The commissioner is not required to perform threat mitigation actions identified under
- 3.7 paragraph (e) that are declined by the subject of the threat.
- 3.8 (g) The house of representatives and the senate, as appropriate, must reimburse the
- 3.9 Department of Public Safety or a law enforcement agency for reasonable personal security
- 3.10 and protection costs incurred under this subdivision."
