Dear Chair Olson and Members of the Ways and Means Committee:

Our associations, the Association of Metropolitan Municipalities (Metro Cities) and the Municipal Legislative Commission (MLC), representing cities throughout the metropolitan area, support HF 30 (Richardson), which is being heard in the Ways and Means Committee on Monday.

Catalytic converter thefts have increased significantly in the metropolitan region and state. Stolen catalytic converters are sold to scrap metal dealers because they contain precious metals like platinum, palladium, and rhodium. Catalytic converter thefts have significant consequences for both individual and community public safety.

Metro Cities and the Municipal Legislative Commission support the statutory changes in HF 30 that make it illegal to be in possession of one or more detached catalytic converters unless it is marked with its removal date and the identification number of the vehicle from which it was removed. We further support provisions in the bill that add requirements for scrap metal dealers purchasing catalytic converters. Requiring proof of lawful removal, delaying payment to sellers, prohibiting cash payments, and other guardrails included in the bill will help curb the theft of catalytic converters across the region and state.
