

Subject Modifying the registration and verification process for individuals required to register as predatory offenders

Overview

Individuals convicted of certain crimes must register as predatory offenders. The individual must provide certain information to confirm the individual's residence.

This bill amends the registration requirements to allow the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension to use various methods to confirm that someone required to register has moved out of state. The bill also authorizes guardians, conservators, and individuals with power of attorney to complete verification and registration paperwork on behalf of the person required to register.

Summary

Section	Description
1	Definitions. Defines the terms "conservator," "guardian," and "power of attorney" for purposes of the statutes governing predatory offender registration.
2	Registration procedure. Amends the methods the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension can use to verify that a person required to register as a predatory offender is living at an address in a new state and allows the bureau to determine if the evidence is sufficient to confirm the person's new residence.
3	Guardians, conservators, and power of attorney. Authorizes the guardian or conservator for, or power of attorney of, a person required to register as a predatory offender to complete all verification and registration paperwork on behalf of the person.
