1.2 Page 1, after line 3, insert:

1.3 "Section 1. Laws 2019, First Special Session chapter 2, article 4, section 2, subdivision
1.4 4, is amended to read:

1.5	Subd. 4. Minnesota Historical Society	15,572,000	17,383,000
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1.6 (a) These amounts are appropriated to the
 1.7 governing board of the Minnesota Historical
 1.8 Society to preserve and enhance access to
 1.9 Minnesota's history and its cultural and
 1.10 historical resources. Grant agreements entered
 1.11 into by the Minnesota Historical Society and
 1.12 other recipients of appropriations in this
 1.13 subdivision must ensure that these funds are
 1.14 used to supplement and not substitute for
 1.15 traditional sources of funding. Funds directly
 1.16 appropriated to the Minnesota Historical
 1.17 Society must be used to supplement and not
 1.18 substitute for traditional sources of funding.
 1.19 Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section
 1.20 16A.28, for historic preservation projects that
 1.21 improve historic structures, the amounts are
 1.22 available until June 30, 2023. The Minnesota
 1.23 Historical Society or grant recipients of the
 1.24 Minnesota Historical Society using arts and
 1.25 cultural heritage funds under this subdivision

2.1 must give consideration to Conservation Corps
2.2 Minnesota and Northern Bedrock Historic
2.3 Preservation Corps, or an organization
2.4 carrying out similar work, for projects with
2.5 the potential to need historic preservation
2.6 services. Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes,
2.7 section 16A.28, or any other law to the
2.8 contrary, the availability of any appropriation
2.9 or grant of money from this subdivision that
2.10 would not otherwise cancel, lapse, or expire
2.11 on or before June 20, 2022, is extended to June
2.12 30, 2023.

2.13 **(b) Historical Grants and Programs**

2.14 (1) Statewide Historic and Cultural Grants

2.15 \$5,846,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$7,004,000
2.16 in fiscal year 2021 are for statewide historic
2.17 and cultural grants to local, county, regional,
2.18 or other historical or cultural organizations or
2.19 for activities to preserve significant historic
2.20 and cultural resources. Money must be
2.21 distributed through a competitive grant
2.22 process. The Minnesota Historical Society
2.23 must administer the money using established
2.24 grant mechanisms, with assistance from the
2.25 advisory committee created under Laws 2009,
2.26 chapter 172, article 4, section 2, subdivision
2.27 4, paragraph (b), item (ii).

2.28 (2) Statewide History Programs

2.29 \$5,846,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$7,004,000
2.30 in fiscal year 2021 are for historic and cultural
2.31 programs and purposes related to the heritage
2.32 of the state. Of this amount, \$250,000 each
2.33 year must be used by the Minnesota Historical
2.34 Society to either produce or purchase and to
2.35 distribute a book to engage and educate

3.1 elementary school students on Minnesota's
3.2 natural resources, legacy, culture, and history.
3.3 The book should be made available for free
3.4 to educators and libraries and through state
3.5 historical society sites to provide to a targeted
3.6 grade of elementary school students.

3.7 (3) History Partnerships

3.8 \$2,500,000 each year is for history
3.9 partnerships involving multiple organizations,
3.10 which may include the Minnesota Historical
3.11 Society, to preserve and enhance access to
3.12 Minnesota's history and cultural heritage in
3.13 all regions of the state.

3.14 (4) Statewide Survey of Historical and
3.15 Archaeological Sites

3.16 \$500,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$500,000 in
3.17 fiscal year 2021 are for one or more contracts
3.18 to be competitively awarded to conduct
3.19 statewide surveys or investigations of
3.20 Minnesota's sites of historical, archaeological,
3.21 and cultural significance. Results of the
3.22 surveys or investigations must be published
3.23 in a searchable form and available to the
3.24 public on a cost-free basis. The Minnesota
3.25 Historical Society, the Office of the State
3.26 Archaeologist, the Indian Affairs Council, and
3.27 the State Historic Preservation Office must
3.28 each appoint a representative to an oversight
3.29 board to select contractors and direct the
3.30 conduct of the surveys or investigations. The
3.31 oversight board must consult with the
3.32 Department of Transportation and Department
3.33 of Natural Resources.

3.34 (5) Digital Library

4.1 \$375,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$375,000 in
4.2 fiscal year 2021 are for a digital library project
4.3 to preserve, digitize, and share Minnesota
4.4 images, documents, and historical materials.
4.5 The Minnesota Historical Society must
4.6 cooperate with the Minitex interlibrary loan
4.7 system and must jointly share this
4.8 appropriation for these purposes.

4.9 (6) Grants

4.10 \$200,000 the first year is for a grant to the
4.11 Minnesota Military Museum to create and
4.12 conduct a statewide story-sharing program to
4.13 honor the distinct service of post-9/11 veterans
4.14 in anticipation of the 2021 anniversary.

4.15 \$115,000 the first year is for a grant to the
4.16 Minnesota Military Museum to care for,
4.17 catalog, and display the recently acquired
4.18 collection of the personal and professional
4.19 effects belonging to General John W. Vessey,
4.20 Minnesota's most decorated veteran.

4.21 \$40,000 the first year is for a grant to the Isanti
4.22 County Historical Society to relocate, update,
4.23 and preserve the Moody School and the
4.24 Grandy Union Church.

4.25 \$150,000 the first year is for a grant to the
4.26 commissioner of natural resources to maintain
4.27 the history of the Grindstone River Dam at
4.28 Hinckley.

4.29 Any unencumbered balance remaining under
4.30 this subdivision the first year does not cancel
4.31 but is available the second year."
