[325E.80] ABNORMAL MARKET DISRUPTIONS; UNCONSCIONABLY 1.6 **EXCESSIVE PRICES.** 1.7 Subdivision 1. **Definitions.** (a) For purposes of this section, the terms in this subdivision 1.8 have the meanings given. 1.9 (b) "Essential consumer good or service" means a good or service that is vital and 1.10 necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the public, including without limitation: 1.11 food; water; fuel; gasoline; shelter; transportation; health care services; pharmaceuticals; 1.12 and medical, personal hygiene, sanitation, and cleaning supplies. 1.13 (c) "Seller" means a manufacturer, supplier, wholesaler, distributor, or retail seller of 1.14 goods and services. 1.15 (d) "Unconscionably excessive price" means a price that represents a gross disparity 1.16 compared to the seller's average price of an essential good or service, offered for sale or 1.17 sold in the usual course of business, in the 60-day period before an abnormal market 1.18 disruption is declared under subdivision 2. None of the following is an unconscionably 1.19 excessive price: 1.20

(1) a price that is substantially related to an increase in the cost of manufacturing,

abnormal m	arket disruption is declared under subdivision 2.

an abnorma	l market disruption if there is a substantial and atypical change in the market
for an essen	tial consumer good or service caused by an event that results in a declaration
of a state of	emergency by the governor.
