The BARR Center (Building Assets, Reducing Risks) is a national non-profit organization dedicated to educational best practices, having been adopted in over **180 schools K-12, in 118 districts** in the United States. BARR is an educational model that improves the education system and creates strong schools and communities by empowering students, teachers, staff, and family with intentionally deepened relationships and data so that schools can re-align existing resources to nurture a unified and personalized culture of support and success for every student, both inside and outside of the classroom.

We believe that not only is education a right, but **success** in education is a right. Equity is a core value of the BARR model, which has been shown to have especially powerful results in closing gaps for students farthest from opportunity. An independent study found that BARR helped narrow gaps in credits earned and passing rate for students of color, males and students living below the poverty line.

Theory of Change/Mediation Analysis

BARR is an evidence-based, transformational system with a suite of 19 positive outcomes and risk reductions - at the student level, teacher level and school level.








South St. Paul Public Schools Implementation
