**Bill Description**

The bill makes a number of adjustments to Minnesota Statute 142A.43, which governs the Youth Intervention Program Grants. The substance remains the same in many cases, such as the duties of the commissioner to manage the application process for the grants, the limit of grant sizes and requirement that organizations leverage matching funds.

The bill requires the commissioner to reserve six percent of funds for the Youth Intervention Grant program for the Youth Intervention Programs Association (YIPA). The previous requirement was five percent.

The bill updates the reporting requirement for the Minnesota Youth Intervention Programs Association from the chairs of the public safety committee to the chairs with jurisdiction over children and youth.

The bill eliminates language that allows the commissioner to reserve a portion of grants for administration.

**Assumptions**

Laws 2025, Chapter 3, Article 22, section 20, sub 2 appropriates \$355,000 each year to the Youth Intervention Programs Association. This bill codifies that appropriation. It is assumed that funding for YIPA would remain the same, creating no impact to DCYF.

Current law appropriates funds to administer the grants directly to DCYF in Laws 2025, Chapter 3, Article 22, section 7. This bill does not change administrative funding for DCYF that is currently appropriated in DCYF's base administrative budget.
