Dear President Trump:

The ongoing federal government shutdown — now the longest shutdown in the history of our nation — is threatening the well-being of Minnesotans, putting our state tax dollars at risk and forcing Minnesotans to deal with declining federal services like the Transportation Security Administration.

As the President, and leader of our nation, we count on you to set the tone and consider the national interest over any one political goal. You can end this shutdown immediately, re-open the government, and then resolve your differences with Congress on border security.

This government shutdown is hurting the lives of real people. The impacts of this shutdown to Minnesotans are severe.

- 6,000 federal employees working in Minnesota are furloughed or working without pay. Another 3,000 workers are at risk because their positions are funded by federal dollars.
- 400,000 low-income Minnesotans on the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) will lose that assistance when funding expires February 28.
- Funding for ten critical public safety programs (including prescription drug monitoring, antiheroin programs, and battered women shelters) could expire on January 18.
- Minnesota's tribal communities have been disproportionately impacted by the shutdown, with immediate cuts to tribal governments and health service offices. Indian Health Services has had to furlough staff.
- Important funding for pesticide, groundwater, and surface monitoring expires February 5.
- \$30 million per month for school nutrition programs (11 million meals/month to 1700 public schools, 269 private schools and 51 residential child care locations) will expire at the end of the month.
- Funding for the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) for five food shelf grantees to provide services to approximately 13,000 seniors per month expires February 28.
- Housing assistance for 21,000 Minnesota households could expire February 1.
- The federal government is not fully operating the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness or Voyageurs National Park, harming local communities and economies that rely on these beautiful national parks.

The consequences and harm to Minnesotans will only become greater the longer this shutdown continues. We urge you in the strongest possible terms to end this gridlock, end the shutdown, and reimburse Minnesota for any state funds that may be used to make up for the failure to meet the federal government's obligations.
