Investments

- More than \$47 million in aid to Hennepin County
- Restoration of Local Government Aid funding

- \$20.5 million for a Management Education Center at Minneapolis Community and Technical College

Generational Transportation Advances

As chairs of legislative transportation committees we led the successful effort to make historic investments in our transportation system. The 2023 transportation bill fixes and maintains our roads and bridges, makes significant investments in transit, bike and pedestrian infrastructure and prioritizes safety. Our economy will grow. Our efforts will reduce the level of greenhouse gasses from transportation which currently constitute the largest source of emissions.

- Leverages \$7.8 billion from the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act
- Providing sustainable funding for a strong and safe transportation system
- Making public transit safer and more convenient
- Addressing the climate crisis
- Support for expanded bike and pedestrian infrastructure and vouchers for e-bikes

Education

Minneapolis public schools will see funding increases of more than \$78.7 million over the next four years. In addition to sustained growth for the general per pupil formula, this includes:

- Historic increased funding for special education, English language learning, and mental health resources
- Breakfast and lunch at school for all students
- Free state college tuition for families with incomes under \$80,000
- Greatly expanded voluntary pre-K early childhood ed opportunities

Fair and Progressive Taxes

We are helping workers, families, and seniors while ensuring the wealthy and big corporations pay their fair share. That's why we passed a tax bill that includes:

- Child tax credits that will reduce childhood poverty by one-third
- Property tax reductions for homeowners and renters
- Elimination of taxes on Social Security income for 75% of all seniors

Environment and Natural Resources

- Banning harmful PFAS chemicals in products
- Preserving and enhancing our natural resources
- Protecting pollinators from pesticides
- Replanting trees killed by Emerald Ash Borer
