

# Gun Safety and Violence Prevention

**Everyday people should be safe doing everyday things.** It is unacceptable that mass shooting after mass shooting happens and common-sense, widely-supported policies like an assault weapons ban are stopped by the gun lobby. Minnesotans are demanding meaningful action on gun violence, and this year, we'll work to pass these essential policies to keep Minnesotans safe.

- **HF 3433 (Greenman):** Ban on military-style assault weapons - which were banned before 2004 and are responsible for the vast majority of mass shootings.
- **HF 3402 (Tabke):** Ban high capacity magazines that are designed to inflict as much harm as possible in the shortest amount of time.
- **HF 3368 (Berg):** Ban binary triggers - devices that turn guns into destructive, deadly weapons of war.
- **TBD (Hollins):** Require the safe storage of firearms to prevent unintentional shootings. Unsecured guns pose clear safety risks, particularly to children.
- **HF 3407 (Pinto):** Regulations of ghost guns that are currently untraceable and used by dangerous individuals to evade state and federal gun laws.
- **TBD (Finke):** Require the reporting of lost or stolen firearms to stop guns from being diverted to the illegal gun market, where they are used to fuel crime across the country.
- **HF 3668 (Bierman):** Establish an Office of Gun Violence Prevention to provide strategic coordination for gun safety policies, communicating with local governments and preventing violence on Day 1.

These are not controversial policies outside of the Capitol, so they shouldn't be controversial inside the Capitol. We all deserve safe communities, where we can go about our days without fear.
