1.1	A House resolution
1.2	celebrating the month of May as Asian Pacific American Heritage Month
1.3	WHEREAS, the month of May was chosen as Asian Pacific American Heritage Month to
1.4	commemorate the immigration of the first Japanese to the United States on May 7, 1843, and to
1.5	mark the anniversary of the completion of the transcontinental railroad on May 10, 1869. The
1.6	majority of the workers who laid the tracks were Chinese immigrants. President Carter signed a
1.7	joint resolution for the celebration on October 5, 1978, and in 1990, President George H. W. Bush
1.8	signed a bill passed by Congress to extend the week to a month; and
1.9	WHEREAS, according to Minnesota's state agency, the Council on Asian Pacific Minnesotans,
1.10	the Asian Pacific Minnesotan community is descended from more than 40 nationalities and is
1.11	arguably the most diverse community in the state. Minnesotans of Hmong, Vietnamese, Lao,
1.12	Cambodian, Bhutanese, and Karen heritage make Minnesota's Asian Pacific community different
1.13	from those in any other state; and
1.14	WHEREAS, May is Asian Pacific American Heritage Month - a celebration of Asians and
1.15	Pacific Islanders in the United States. Broadly, Asian/Pacific encompasses all of the Asian continent
1.16	and the Pacific islands of Melanesia (New Guinea, New Caledonia, Vanuatu, Fiji, and the Solomon
1.17	Islands), Micronesia (Marianas, Guam, Wake Island, Palau, Marshall Islands, Kiribati, Nauru, and
1.18	the Federated States of Micronesia), and Polynesia (New Zealand, Hawaiian Islands, Rotuma,
1.19	Midway Islands, Samoa, American Samoa, Tonga, Tuvalu, Cook Islands, French Polynesia, and
1.20	Easter Island); and
1.21	WHEREAS, Asian Pacific Americans are the fastest growing racial group in our country,
1.22	growing over four times as rapidly as the population of the United States; and
1.23	WHEREAS, Asian Pacific Americans lend their rich heritage to enhance our communities
1.24	and our culture; and

WHEREAS, Asian Pacific Minnesotans are university professors, realtors, nurses, veterans, authors, nonprofit leaders, business owners, social justice advocates, software engineers, police officers, teachers, chefs, judges, doctors, and local and state elected officials; and WHEREAS, there are more than 6,000 Hmong-American veterans who live in Minnesota who put their lives on the line with the United States armed forces; and WHEREAS, our state has a growing population of 20,000 Karen refugees. Most Karen people reside in Ramsey County, with populations also living in Austin, Albert Lea, Marshall, Worthington, and Willmar; and WHEREAS, Minnesota is home to more than 47,000 Asian Indians, one of the fastest growing ethnic groups in the state. The majority of the community resides in the Twin Cities metropolitan area, followed by Rochester; and WHEREAS, Asian Pacific Americans often face discrimination, harassment, and violence; and WHEREAS, in 2015, a working group on violence against Asian women and children was established in the Minnesota Department of Health; and WHEREAS, in 2016, the Legislature passed the All Kids Count Act to disaggregate student data to reveal disparities along lines of race and ethnicity, English language ability, foster care status, military family status, gender, low-income status, and disabilities; and WHEREAS, many cultural events are held throughout the year, serving as opportunities for elected and appointed officials to build relationships and learn how their decisions impact communities of Asian Pacific Americans; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota that it recognizes the month of May as Asian Pacific American Heritage Month and celebrates the many contributions Asian Pacific Americans have made to our state. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives is directed to prepare an enrolled copy of this resolution, to be authenticated by his signature and that of the Speaker and transmit it to the Council on Asian Pacific Minnesotans.
