

FRONTLINE WORKER BONUS PAY FACT SHEET


House Democrats, Senate Democrats, and Gov. Walz all agree: Minnesota's frontline workers deserve bigger bonus checks.

Who is a frontline worker?

The House DFL proposal includes the following occupations in the definition of a frontline worker:

- 1. Long-term care and home care
- 2. Health care, excluding physicians
- 3. Emergency responders
- 4. Public health, social service, and regulatory service
- 5. Courts and corrections
- 6. Child care
- 7. Public schools, including charter schools, state schools, and higher education
- 8. Food service, including production, processing, preparation, sale, and delivery
- 9. Retail, including sales, fulfillment, distribution, and delivery
- 10. Temporary shelters and hotels
- 11. Building services, including maintenance, janitorial, and security
- 12. Public transit
- 13. Ground and air transportation services
- 14. Manufacturing
- 15. Vocational rehabilitation.
