Overview

This act modifies the licensing requirements for power limited technicians under the Minnesota Electrical Act. Current law requires each applicant for a power limited technician license to have either (1) graduated from an approved four-year electrical course at an accredited college or university, or (2) at least three years of experience (subject to a credit of up to 2000 hours for completing a two-year post high school electrical course or other approved technical training). This act exempts from these statutory requirements persons who apply to take the power limited technician exam by September 30, 2005.

- 1** **Power limited technician.** Exempts persons who submit an application by September 30, 2005, to take the power limited technician examination administered by the Board of Electricity from the education and experience qualifications described above.

Makes this section effective the day following final enactment.
