Overview

This act establishes an examination extension for medical licensure applicants who are mobilized into active military service during the process of taking the United States Medical Licensing Examination.

- 1 Examination extension; active military service.** Amends § 147.02, by adding subd. 1a. Allows the board to grant an extension to the time period required to pass the United States Medical Licensing Examination, if an applicant is mobilized into active military service during the process of taking the exam, but before passage of all steps.

Requires proof of active military service to be submitted to the Board of Medical Practice on the forms and according to the timelines of the board.

Makes this section effective retroactively from December 1, 2005.
