## **Overview**

This is the annual liquor omnibus bill.

## Section

- **Microdistillery.** Defines a microdistillery as a business making fewer than 40,000 proof gallons of distilled spirits in a year.
- **Proof gallon.** Defines a proof gallon.
- **Bond.** Establishes bond requirements for microdistilleries.
- **Brewer taproom license.** Creates a new class of license, a brewer taproom license, issued by local governments for sale at on-sale of a brewer's beer in a taproom at or adjacent to their brewery. Requires dram shop to be carried by the brewer. Allows one taproom per brewer. Prohibits large (over 250,000 barrels) brewers from having a taproom. Allows a local license fee.
- 5 **Microdistiller fee.** Establishes a license fee to cover licensing costs.
- **License not required.** Allows bed and breakfast establishments who can currently serve two glasses of wine, to be allowed to serve 12 ounces of Minnesota produced beer.
- 7 Cities; auto racing facilities. Allows cities to issue on-sale licenses at racing tracks.
- **Wine festival.** Allows for an annual wine festival to showcase wines; allows up to two glasses of wine per customer to be served.

- **9 Airports Commission.** Allows the airports commission to have licenses that are not in compact or contiguous spaces.
- Temporary on-sale licenses; farm winery. Allows municipalities to issue a temporary license to farm wineries for on-sale at a county fair located within the municipality. Allows license fees; requires approval by commissioner.
- **Private college.** Allows private nonprofit colleges to have liquor licenses, issued by municipalities. These licenses may be for non-contiguous spaces; for sales on all days of the week to persons attending events at the private college.
- **Licenses prohibited in certain areas.** Removes outdated area of service language for public universities.
- White Bear township; authority to issue licenses. Allows White Bear Lake township to issue licenses within its jurisdiction.
- Changes in status; grandfather provision. Allows the city of Rochester to have 26 off-sale licenses, notwithstanding restrictions on cities of the first class. Rochester transitioned to being a city of the first class this year.
- Community baseball; alcohol issues review. Provides for an interim study of liquor provision in baseball venues.
- **Effective date.** This is a technical correction to an earlier bill, already signed into law.
